I can't believe winter hit us so hard so early in the season. We had blankets on every horse except Faith by the first week of November, and we don't usually need them until late December. (Faith is as hardy as they come and has never needed one.) As blessings continue to overflow at the ranch, we can only continue to be thankful.

One student this summer was a boy who had experienced trauma and was not quick to converse. Often, I could only get him to respond with one-word answers. He chose Cezar as his horse and I began to talk about where Cezar came from and what he liked and didn't like. My student was captivated by the big appaloosa's goofy personality. He started talking to Cezar about everything they were about to do and they conquered obstacle after obstacle together in the arena. He never really did open up to me, but I know this boy found a relationship he could trust in Cezar and that alone means the world to us.

A Great Opportunity



A new equine-facilitated therapy program is opening in Urbana, Illinois, called Miniature Horse Power. The program is still in its infancy, but an introductory seminar was held recently on December 7. Our own Emily Reichman was invited to be one of three keynote speakers for the event. Hope Lives Youth Ranch got a lot of good press in return as she got to share about equine behavior, what we do, why we do it, and how it works. What a wonderful privilege! As miniature Horse Power begins to solidify, we will continue to help each other grow in order to better serve the east-central Illinois region. Mini Horse Power will be working through Dreaam House, using miniature horses in equine-assisted psychotherapy within Urbana city limits. They hope to be up and running next year.
