## **Great Strides**

I met a girl this summer who was struggling with anxiety. I asked her out to the ranch when our 2020 season ended. She would not say much to me when she first got here and she was nervous around the horses. I paired her with Cezar. Cezar stood like a rock while she brushed him and petted him. She was only going to be able to visit us once, so we put the saddle on Cezar, just in case, but left the barn with no intention of riding. Cezar was patient and sweet while she got comfortable leading him around the riding ring, walking him over some ground poles, and getting him to stop and turn. Eventually, she turned to me and asked guietly if she could ride. I nodded and we took Cezar to the stairs where she could climb on. I led her around while she got used to the movement of the horse beneath her and slowly she began chatting about her dogs at home and what she liked to do. By the end of the session, she asked if we could do a few steps of trot on him before we finished. Cezar was happy to oblige. I was so excited to see so much improvement in a student in just one session. I cannot wait for next year when I will get to spend a whole 7-week round with her!
